Dear Test Taker,

Thank you for your enquiry regarding special accommodation for your test. IELTS is a high-stakes test, and we will require medical documentation to assess your request and provide appropriate test administration.

Please ask your specialist physician to provide a doctor's note on letterhead, dated and signed (no more than 6 months prior). Your physician should address the questions below. Alternatively, you may provide an existing report with a note from your doctor saying your condition remains unchanged.

1. What is the nature of the patient's condition for which you are requesting medical accommodation in the IELTS Test?
2. How was the condition assessed (tests/ review previous documents from another physician etc.)?
3. Is this an on-going condition; is there a reason to believe that the nature of the condition will remain the same indefinitely?
4. How can your patient best be accommodated (e.g., the amount of extra time for each part of the test, special equipment etc.) so as to neither **advantage nor disadvantage** your patient on their IELTS test?

Please submit your report to the test centre director for further evaluation at: loretta.revoczi@ilac.com. Further details of the next steps will be provided after submission. All accommodations are subject to medical documentation being approved by our Head Office (IDP). Please wait for this approval before making plans for your test date.

Please note special accommodations can take up to 3 months to arrange depending on the nature of the arrangement. We cannot guarantee test availability.
